WHAT IS DOMESTIC AND FAMILY VIOLENCE?

Domestic and family violence occurs when a partner, family member, or another person uses power and control to harm, intimidate, or dominate another person.

This can take many forms such as:

- Physical abuse

- Emotional or psychological abuse

- Verbal abuse

- Financial control

- Sexual abuse

- Threats or intimidation

- Spiritual or cultural abuse

- Social isolation or controlling behaviours

Domestic and family violence can affect women, children, families, communities and **no one deserves to experience it.**

KWHC IS A PLACE OF HEALING TO BUILD A SAFE AND STRONG FUTURE

WHO CAN ACCESS KWHC?

Preference of residency is given to **Indigenous women aged 16 years old or above**, who are experiencing unsafe domestic and family violence and/or homelessness

Dependent **children under the age of 16 years must be supervised at all times** while residing in the centre.

WHAT IS THE HEALING CENTRE?

The Katungul Women's Healing Centre (KWHC) is a culturally safe and holistic service that **supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women and children** who are experiencing domestic and family violence and/or severe homelessness as a result.

The centre provides safe and ongoing accommodation support, with individual or family rooms available. There are shared common spaces for residents such as the kitchen, living room and dining area, as well as an outdoor space with a yarning circle.

The centre offers programs to promote and encourage healing and recovery. These programs can take place within the facility, or out on Country.

WHAT IS OUR AIM?

Our aim is to **provide culturally appropriate care** that supports healing, strengthens wellbeing, and promotes resilience and self-determination in a safe environment for Indigenous women and children

WHAT DO WE DO?

Our Indigenous workers will be on-site to provide individual case management to support goals and aspirations:

- Healthcare services**

- Mental health and/or counselling specialists**

- Cultural healing and connection**

- Advocacy and case management**

- Assistance accessing housing, employment, education, legal support, and more**
